### **”Sustainable Urban Development in Latin American Megacities: Santiago 2030”**

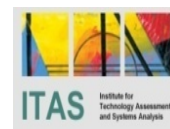
**October 27-28, 2010 (Santiago de Chile)**

The Sustainable Development and Human Settlements Division of ECLAC, together with the German Helmholtz Association, the Physical Sciences and Mathematics Faculty of University of Chile, the Institute of Urban Studies of the Catholic University, the Karlsruhe Institute of Technology, and the Helmholtz Centre for Environmental Research Leipzig kindly invite you to the International Conference ”Sustainable Urban Development in Latin American Megacities: Santiago 2030”, taking place at the United Nations Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean (ECLAC) on October 27 and 28, 2010.

The basic objective of the conference is to discuss about the challenges of sustainable urban development in Latin America. The first day will be dedicated to present and discuss with scientist and political decision makers essential results of the “Risk Habitat Megacity” project regarding the current sustainability performance of Santiago de Chile and recommendations for future development. The project involved several scientific and political partners in Chile, including the government of the Metropolitan Region and the United Nations Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean (ECLAC), and scientists from five centres of the German Helmholtz Association.

The second day opens up the debate to other Latin American megacities. Starting from the Santiago research case, the objective is to compare and contrast this experience with other Latin American metropolitan regions and to move towards a new metropolitan research agenda for the twenty-first century in order to stimulate new collaborations.

With this concept, the conference addresses topic-related scientific communities, decision makers in policy and planning, and related NGOs.
